**Robert Etien** is currently Dean of the Faculty of Law, Political and Social Sciences of the University of Paris 13 which hosts four thousand students in the disciplines of Law, Economic and Social Administration, and Political Science, three research centres, more than hundred and fifty teachers and twenty-five members of administrative staff. He is Director of the Master's Degree in Business and International Trade with Emerging Nations. He heads the CERAL (Centre for Research on Local Action) research centre. He had previously served as Vice-President of the administrative board of the University of Paris 13 and is currently President of the University Statutes Commission.

**Pierre-Yves Monjal** is Professor of Public Law (holds a Ph.D) in the University of Paris 13. A specialist in Community Law, he has written numerous articles (more than hundred) on issues relating to the European Union and their repercussions on French law. He has authored five books and been legal adviser to the Ministry of Economy and Budget on questions involving Community law. He is an elected member of the Montrichard Municipal Council. He also teaches at the Institute of Political Studies, Paris. His current research interests centre on Public Procurement Law.

**Claudine Moutardier** holds a doctorate in Law from the University of Paris I-Sorbonne. She is currently Research Engineer in the University of Paris 13. She is also in charge of the Federal Centre for Research in Law and the European Documentation Centre. She regularly contributes to the chronicle «Questions of Interest to France» and «Conventions Concluded by France» in the *Annuaire français de droit international*.

**Charles Reiplinger** teaches public law, legal and political theory in Paris (Université de Paris 13).
