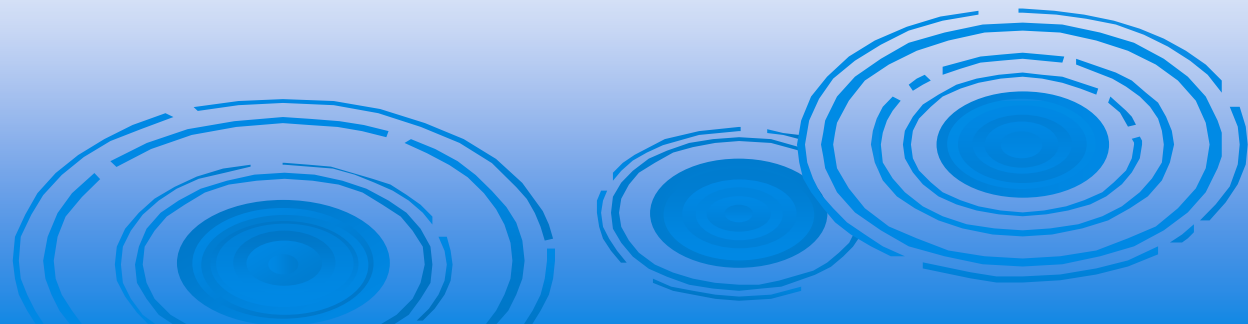

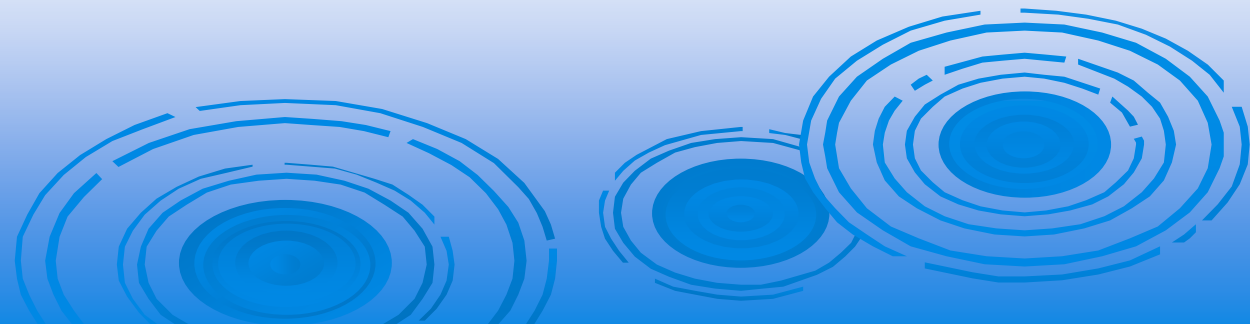

Doctoral School

➤ **Purpose:** Hosting and Guiding the research of those wanting to write a thesis with a view to obtaining a Ph.D in Law from the University of Paris 13 is ensured by the Erasmus Doctoral School.

➤ **Organisation:** Thirteen Research centres organized under two major subjects, each endowed with its own board of studies :

- **Économies, Societies, Industries et Cultures (ESIC)** - **Subjects, Codes, Cultures, Spaces and Societies (SUCCES)**

➤ **Academic orientation is structured around six crossdisciplinary themes :**

1. Innovation, Mutation, Change 2. Rules, Codes, Codification, Rites 3. International Measures and Issues, from a comparatist or comparative point of view 4. Subject(s) and Society(ties)
5. Culture(s) and Representations 6. Languages, Corpus, Computer Science
